Test run train through Jamuna Railway Bridge



Bangladesh Railway (BR) conducted a trail- run through Jamuna Railway bridge on Tuesday, 25 November, 2024 at 10:00am at speed of 120km per hour. Starting from the east side of Tangail-Bhuapur par, the train crossed the bridge and arrived at Sirajganj west part of the route. The bridge has the provision for crossing of both meter gage and broad gage train. As gathered from the concerned Project Director, the 4.80 km long bridge is scheduled to be inaugurated formally on mid-January, 2025. He further stated that ECNEC approved the project on 6th December, 2016 at a cost of Tk 16,780 crore and 7 lac of which Tk 12,149 crore 2 lac will be financed by JAICA. He also informed that in total 88 nos. passenger and goods train can pass through the bridge in every

LGED Constructs PSC Girder Bridge



Under the Greater Dhaka Infrastructure Development Project-3(1st Revised) in Gazipur district, construction work of a 90-meter Pre bridge has been Stressed Girder completed over the Matikata River in Sreepur Upazila of Gazipur district. Before the bridge was built, people from both banks used to travel by boat. Now as the construction of the bridge is completed, people on both side of alpukurpar Bazar via Shimultala Bazar in

Sreepur upazila of Gazipur district can travel easily. By using the bridge as a connecting road, it is possible to transport rice, corn, vegetables and fish to different parts of the country including the capital at a low cost. Thus LGED is a major contributor for providing connectivity facility throughout the country, rural areas in particular.

PWD Constucts 500-bed Hospital



Public Works Department(PWD) has constructed a massive 500- bed Genral Hospital at Mugda within the capital city of Dhaka. The aim of the project is to provide facility for modern and comparatively cheaper treatment among the poor section of the city dwellers of eastern part of Dhaka city in particular. With the implementation of the project, basic need for health care facility will be extended to cater to the need of the poorer section of the people of the city.

The hospital stands on a plot of 9.52 acres land in Mugda area comprises of a picturesque massive 13-storied main hospital building provided with all kind of modern treatment facilities. The hospital building has a total floor area of 50,8471 sftoccupying almost40,000 sft per floor, provided with 360 bed, 140 cabin, 8 nos. OT, 2 nos. Minor OT and 22 nos. post- operative bed. Cost of the GoB funded project is Tk 105.26 crores only. Poorer section of the city dwellers will be immensely benifitted out of the health care facility provded from the hospital.

47th ECM of ACECC Held



Executive Committee Meeting (ECM) of Asian Civil Engineering Coordinating Council (ACECC) was held recently in Wellington, capital city of New Zealand. Engineers New Zealand (ENZ), a Member Society of ACECC hosted the occasion on 20-22 October, 2024 in a befitting manner. Out of the 17 member societies, most of the societies except a few attended virtually, took part in the meeting. The lone member from IEB Engr. Malek Shikder, the Chairman, Award Sub-committee attended the meeting virtually.

The 47th ECM was held on Tuesday, 22 October, 2024 after confirmation of official representatives and establishment of the quorum including a brief review of the minutes of the 46th ECM held in Manila, Philippines which was approved after IEP motioned and seconded by NEA. The TCCM and PCM commenced in orderly manner before the ECM where decision were taken in the light of the meeting outcome of the TCCM and PCM. Following were the recommended items from TCCM and PCM and PCM and their approval.

TCCM items: I)TC34: New TC named as Research & Development of offshore wind Technology, ii) TC34: renamed of title as Green Energy in Wind Engineering in, iii) Endorsement of ASCE 73 for sustainable infrastructure (73-23); PCM items; I) approval of PCM minutes, ii) acceptance of membership application of RSCE, iii) approval of ACECC Awards result as presented by Engr. Malek Shikder of IEB, Awards-



Sub-Committee Chair, iv) The SG and Awards Sub-Committee Chair will make recommendation to amend the rules that may be considered at the 48th ECM, to be hosted in Yangon, and likely voted upon at the 49th ECM to be hosted in Jelu, S. Korea. v) consideration of one time subsidy from ACECC reserve, to assist with the CECEAR 10 corporate contribution either of the 2 option A(50%) and B(75%) whereby option B recommended. Thereafter, Secretariat Report on ACECC Activities and Finance Committee Report were approved after those were presented. Then threadbare discussion on plans for the 48th ECM were made and after sequential presentation by ICE(I), PICE and CICHE, CICHE's proposal was accepted for hosting CECAR 11 in

Taiwan as being the highest vote receiver. As there being no other transaction for discussion, the meeting ended with thanks to the chair.

Since ACECC's mission has always been to foster collaboration, share knowledge and promote sustainable development across diverse engineering communities in Asia, ENZ's sincere efforts and initiative as a host was very successful including its impeccable hospitality. The meeting expressed sincere thanks to ENZ for managing a remarkable and entertaining ECM. The meeting ended with thanks to the chair and wishing all the participants of all Member Societies meeting again at the 48th ECM in April, 2025 in Yangon, Myanmar.
